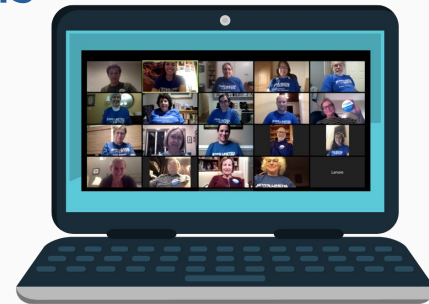

Every Vote Matters!

- Montgomery County level races – whoever wins the **Democratic Primary** generally wins the **General Election**
- **Only about 10%** of eligible people vote in the primaries
- **2022 primary** – County Executive Marc Elrich **won by 32 votes**
- **2018 primary** – District 16 State Delegate Sarah Love **won by 12 votes**

Notes about Local Elections

- 2026 Ballot – all **MD** + most **Montgomery County** offices
- Party registration required to vote in primary, except for nonpartisan Board of Education
- No ranked choice voting or runoffs

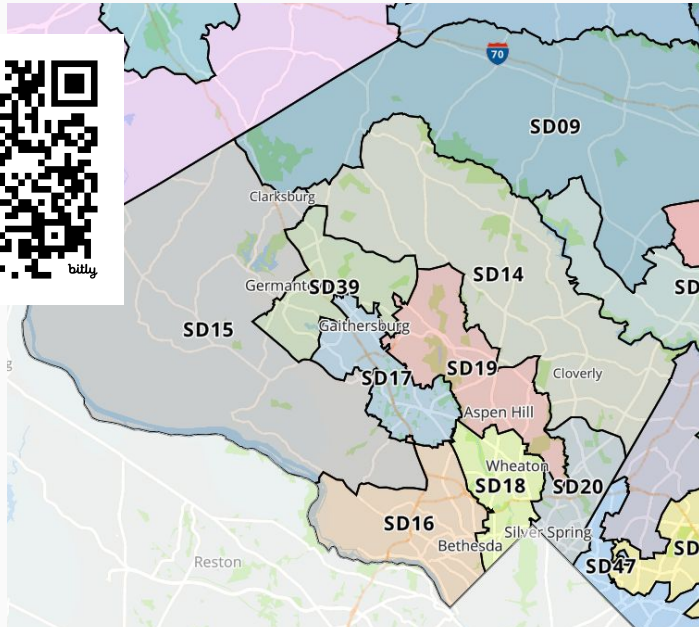

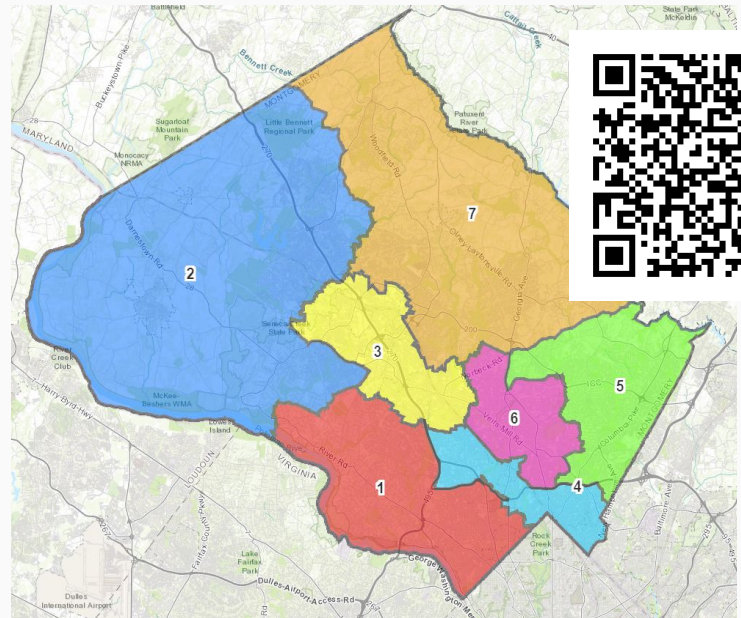

Montgomery County Districts



County Districts Demographics

- **1.1 million residents - more than 60%** are Black, Latino, Native American, Asian American and/or Pacific Islander
- **4 of top 10** most diverse cities in the US
- **1/3 of residents** born outside of the US
- **6 out of 7 county districts** are majority communities of color
 - **District 5 – Black residents** are largest group
 - **District 6 – Latino residents** are largest group

Public Financing

- Makes running for office more equitable and accessible
- Reduces influence of large contributions - no corporations or PACS
- **Donations from County residents matched on sliding scale**
 - County Executive = \$50 becomes \$400
 - County Council = \$50 becomes \$300
- **Maximum individual contribution:**
 - Publicly financed candidates: \$500
 - Traditionally financed candidates: \$6,000

Public Financing cont.

- Candidates using public financing are noted on slides
- Some candidates haven't met the threshold to be certified
 - County Executive threshold: \$40,000 from 500 County residents
 - County Council has lower thresholds

What is the County Executive's Role?

- Leads executive branch of County government, including departments such as Health and Human Services, Police, Transportation
- Proposes County's operating and capital budgets
- Responsible for implementing and enforcing all County legislation
- Leadership in times of emergency

Case Study: Funding Eviction Prevention and Homelessness Services

JUFJ Partner: [Housing Justice Montgomery](#)

- County Executive drafts proposed County budget
- FY26 budget: **26% increase** to programs to end and prevent homelessness – largest in County history
- Overwhelming majority of County Exec's proposed budget gets voted into law

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County Council



What is the County Council's Role?

- **Legislative branch**
 - Write County's laws
 - Review, amend, approve operating and capital budgets
 - Oversee land use
 - Confirm key executive branch appointments
 - Oversight of key county functions, such as schools and the police department
- **Constituent services**

County Council Elections

- **County Council has 11 members**
 - 7 District members
 - 4 At-Large members
- **7 Districts are roughly equal in population**
 - Average of 107,000 voters per district
 - 2022 district primaries – at MOST 25,000 people voted
- Councilmembers serve 4 year terms with a 3 term limit

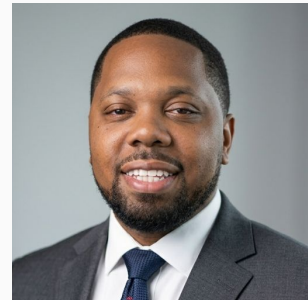

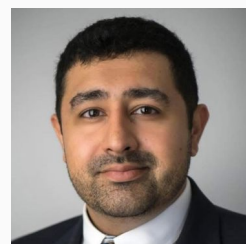

What's at Stake in the County Council Races?

Case Study: Rent Stabilization

JUFJ Partners: [We are CASA](#), [Everyday Canvassing](#), [MCEA](#), [SEIU Local 500](#), [DSA](#), [Shepherd's Table](#), and more!

- **2023: Permanent rent stabilization** passed, capping rent and preventing evictions for thousands of County residents
- **70% decrease** in buildings on troubled properties list for code violations
- Next Council could weaken / roll back rent stabilization OR ensure it continues to protect 40% of County residents who are renters

- **Appoints** superintendent
- **Determines** school boundaries
- County Executive and County Council
MCPS oversight role is limited to the
budget process

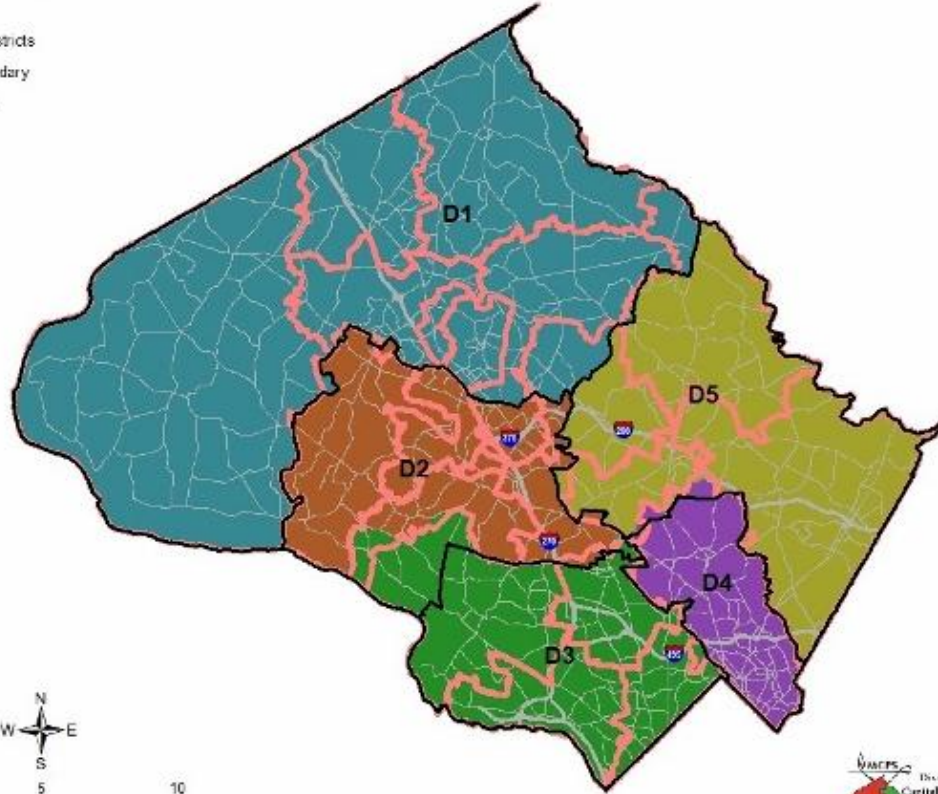

Proposed Districts

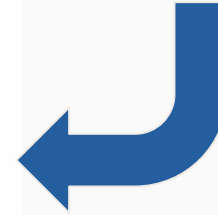
Cluster Boundary

- **Non-partisan**
 - Political party registration not required to vote in primary
- **Primary vs. General:**
 - Top 2 candidates from primary → general election
 - 2 or fewer candidates → directly to the general election

- Board of Ed has reduced funding for restorative justice staffing and programs
- New harsher code of conduct = more suspensions of students of color + students with disabilities

- Leads executive branch
- Responsible for state departments
- Significant control over budget
- Can veto bills passed by the state legislature – can be overturned with 3/5 majority

What's at Stake in the Race for Governor?

Case Study: Women's Pre-release Center

- JUFJ Partners: [Out for Justice](#), [Maryland Justice Project](#), and others
- **Maryland's first pre-release center for women:** provides employment, housing, and health care for people leaving incarceration
- **2020 - 2021:** Legislation passed, Governor Hogan's veto overridden, no funds allocated
- **2024:** Advocates successfully lobbied to add funds to the capital budget
- **2026:** Still waiting for construction to begin at a suitable location

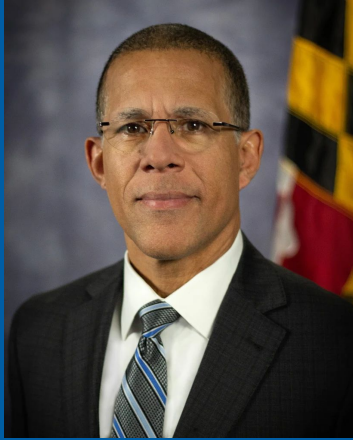

What is the Attorney General's Role?

- Chief legal officer
- Supervises Maryland legal affairs
- Advises agencies, boards, commissions, officials, and institutions of state government
- Reviews rules/regulations
- Enforces consumer and commerce protection from unfair practices
- Represents Maryland in statewide/federal litigation, including prosecuting crimes against the state and handling appeals of criminal convictions

Case Study: ICE activity at Healthcare Facilities

- Current Attorney General issued guidance on protecting Marylanders from ICE activity at medical centers:
 - Clarifying ICE's legal limitations
 - Step-by-step guidance when immigration officer are present

“No Marylander, regardless of immigration status, should have to choose between their health and safety” - Attorney General Brown

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General Assembly



What is the General Assembly's Role?

- Creates Maryland's laws during 90-day session (January - April)
- Legislators consider 2,000-3,000 bills and pass hundreds of bills
- Not full time - legislators have other jobs
- Sometimes hold a special session
- Review, alter, and approve state budget
- Constituent services

Make up of the General Assembly

- 141 members - House of Delegates
- 47 members - State Senate
- **Most** of the 47 legislative districts =
1 senator + 3 delegates
- **Entire General Assembly
is up for election in 2026**
- No term limits or public financing



Montgomery County - State Districts

- **State Districts in Mont County: 9A, 14-20, and 39**
- **Senate races:** All incumbent senators running for reelection; five have no challengers
- **Delegate races:**
 - Challengers in every district except 20
 - Top three vote getters from each party primary move to the general election (two in 9A)

Case Study: Ending Youth Autocharge

JUFJ Partners: [Maryland Youth Justice Coalition](#)

- **14 year fight** with a big win in 2026!
- Over 1,000 kids automatically sent to adult courts and prisons in Maryland each year
- Kids in adult system are denied developmentally appropriate support, more likely to reoffend
- **2026 bill** will cut in half number of kids automatically charged as adults

- **June 2:** Deadline for advanced Voter Registration + Change of Party Affiliation
 - Also can register in person during early voting/election day
- **June 11 - June 18: Primary Early Voting, 7 AM - 8 PM**
 - Vote at any of the 14 early voting sites
- **Tuesday, June 23: Primary Election, 7 AM - 8 PM**

#2 - Vote by Mail

- **June 16:** Request mail-in ballot by mail or fax
- **June 19:** Request mail-in ballot from State's website
- **June 23:** Request mail-in ballot in person at Board of Elections
- Return mail-in ballots at one of **58 drop box locations** by 8pm on election day

What is the Comptroller's Role?

- Chief financial officer + chief accountant
- Collects \$16 billion taxes + conducts audits
- Comptroller on the Board of Public Works with Governor + Treasurer
- Board of Public Works:
 - Reviews/approves capital projects + procurement contracts
 - Oversees budget actions when the legislature is not in session
 - Key decision-maker on transit projects

State's Attorney

What is the State's Attorney Role?

- **County** level position
- **Prosecutor** – all criminal offenses under state/local laws
- **Independent** – does not report to County Executive or County Council
- **Broad powers** – whom to prosecute, what charges to bring, recommendations for pretrial release and sentencing, use of diversion programs
- **Candidate:**

Sheriff's Office

What is the Sheriff's Role:

- Local law enforcement arm of Judicial System
- Independent – does not report to County Executive or County Council
- Carries out evictions, enforces child support, Responsible for combating domestic violence

Clerk of the Court

What is the Clerk of the Court's Role:

- Manages papers, books, records of MD Court System
- Administers oaths, licenses, swearing-ins
- Assisted by 200 staff members to ensure transparency and justice in court system

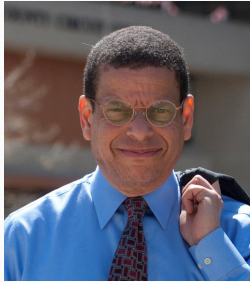

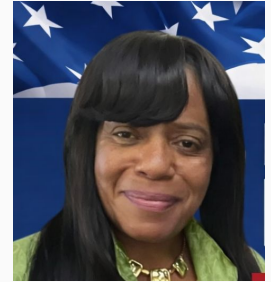

Judges of the Circuit Court

What is the Circuit Court's Role:

- Where jury trials are held
- Handle serious criminal cases + major civil cases
- Handle juvenile and other family law cases such as divorce, custody and child support, and domestic violence cases
- Cases can be decided by juries or by the judge



Selection of Circuit Court Judges

- When there is an open seat, such as when a judge retires, the Governor appoints a **nominating commission**, which vets and nominates candidates
- Governor reviews nominations + **appoints a judge** to fill the seat
- Judges are on the ballot **the first election year** after being appointed
- Other judges in MD are general election only with yes/no for retention
- General Assembly has considered legislation to change Circuit Court process to match other types of MD judges

Election of Circuit Court Judges

- Circuit Court Judge races are non-partisan
- Candidates appear on both Democratic and Republican primary ballots
- Top 4 **candidates** in the primary election from **both parties** move on to the **general election**
- Top 4 **candidates** in the general election are elected to **serve 15 year terms**

Democratic & Republican Central Committees

What is the Central Committee's Role:

- Local governing body for the Democratic and Republican parties
- Selects replacement for a candidate who leaves office if a candidate leaves office during term
- Full power on all party matters, including organization, maintenance, and conduct
- Central committees responsible for organizing + voter turnout for their party

Democratic & Republican Central Committees

Selection of Representatives:

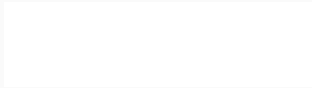
- 2 per district and 8 at-large, plus 1 in half-district (9a)
- No more than half of the reps from a district can be the same gender
